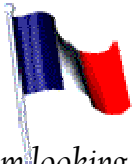


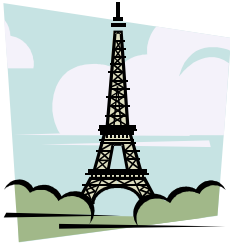
## *French 3-4*

Questions and Answers...

How do I earn my grade? Each day you will earn points from homework, participation, quizzes, test, and other projects. Each of these is a part of your total grade for the semester. Your grades can be checked online at any time. Keep up to date on where you are at!

How do I earn credit in this class? Each new lesson in this class will build upon the material that you previously learned. Therefore, it is necessary that you have control over the material in order to move into higher levels of the language. The grading scale for this class reflects this need.

90%-100%	= A = 1	Examples:	74.5% = 3 = credit
80%-89%	= B = 2		69.3% = 4 = credit
70%-79%	= C = 3		64.2% = 5 = no credit
65%-69%	= D = 4		
below 65%	= F = 5 no credit		



What about when I am absent? It is your responsibility to find out what material and/or assignments you have missed. Assignments must be made up within 5 school days to gain credit for missed work. Check the classroom website to find out what will be covered on the quiz on Friday.

What do I do when I am tardy? I follow the CHS Handbook policy for tardies. If you are not in your seat when the bell rings, you are tardy. If you are swept, you must turn in any homework to the "sweeps" teacher. Otherwise, it will not be accepted. If you are swept on a test day, I reserve the right to call you out of sweeps and have you take the test. If you miss a test, you must contact me the day you are swept and I will schedule a time for you to make it up. Participation points cannot be made up for a sweep.

What about when there is a substitute? When I am absent from class, I expect that you will be on your best behavior. The sub will be writing down names of students who are off task or disruptive. He/She should be treated just like any other teacher on campus. Any misbehavior will be punished doubly.

What is this “Euro” for? Euros are the European form of money. If you need to go to the restroom, you will need to use your Euro to pay for the trip. If you do not use your Euro, you may turn it in at the end of the quarter for extra credit.

Why do I have to keep a notebook? Your notebook will be your “textbook” and reference guide for the class. It must be nicely organized and is worth about 20% of your quarter grade. In it, you will keep records of your completed homework assignments and keep all of your graded materials for reference later in the year. Lost notebooks will be lost credit. Be responsible. You must also have a pen with you each day, in order to write in your notebook.

How often will we take tests? We will take a quiz each Friday, and tests about once a month. This is your demonstration to me of what YOU have learned. Cheating will not be tolerated, and will result in loss of credit. We will take speaking tests at the end of each unit and these will be heavily weighted in your grade.

I look forward to having you in my class again this year, and I think we will have a lot of fun learning about French and cultures around the world. If you have any questions or concerns, please let me know.
